The effects of Ebola in Liberia will be felt for a long time. Liberia dropped to ranked as the 3rd poorest country in the world (Africaranking.com) with 85% of the population living on less than \$1/day.

Ebola claimed the lives of 4400 people; over 850 were Nurses and Doctors. This has devastated the already under staffed medical systems. People suffering from waterborne diseases now have little or no health care. Providing safe water is now more important than ever.

Our Liberian teams have worked throughout the Ebola crisis. In the last 10 months, they have drilled 35 wells and repaired 85 broken handpumps. Each well you have supported is making a difference keeping people healthy! The children of Liberia thank you!



Nigeria Pushing Through ...

The world has watched as on-going Boko Haram terrorist attacks make life very dangerous. The need for nearby village water sources is critical to keep girls as safe as possible. In the past year, our Nigerian teams have drilled 11 new wells and rehabilitated 3 old wells. Here's a letter from one of these projects:

"CMF Orphanage began when missionaries discovered that the practice of killing twins was ongoing in some rural communities. Babies, considered evil if the mother died in childbirth and once buried alive with the mother, now have a home in this orphanage. When we discovered this orphanage they had no safe water supply and the health of the children suffered. We told Lifewater Canada of this situation, and her donors sponsored their new well. All day long, children drink cold, safe water from the new pump. It will continue to be a blessing for generations".

Building an Operations base in Haiti

Kenya Harnesses the Power of the Sun!

This past year, the Lifewater team in Kenya drilled 5 new wells, built 2 large concrete water holding tanks, and rehabilitated 2 ancient school wells. This was a major struggle as they coped with serious mechanical issues.

The team showed their progressive side by adding the installation of solar water pumps to their skill sets. This is a dependable green option for remote areas where fuel is expensive and electrical supplies are intermittent at best.

An overseas training trip this fall, will focus on supporting the early stages of implementation of Kenya's strategic plan. Volunteers will work with the new Assistant Program Coordinator, help step up the team's pump repair program and provide computer training for office staff.
