

The Life-Saving Value of Community Toilets and Hand-Washing Stations


Lifewater Canada was established in 1997 to drill and repair wells so people in Africa and Haiti could have safe and accessible water, just like we do in North America.














But water from even the safest and most reliable sources still becomes contaminated if people don't have proper toilets and other sanitation facilities.











So Lifewater Canada, in addition to drilling and repairing wells, is building community toilets in villages and at schools and churches.



















Toilets are vital to girls and women during their menstrual cycles so they can care for themselves with dignity.



If their local school has no toilet, many girls stay home – and fall behind in their studies, sometimes dropping out.











Toilets alone won't provide adequate sanitation for everyone, so we also install hand-washing stations and teach the value of using them.
